



ACEA Extended COVID-19 Learning Plan Reconfirmation Meeting April 20, 2021 *Required Monthly After Initial Plan Approval Public Act 149 (August 2020) and Public Act 165 (October 2020) require ACEA to develop and revise as needed an Extended Covid-19 Learning Plan and to convene a monthly reconfirmation meeting for the purpose of:

- Reconfirm how instruction is to be delivered during the 2020-2021 school year
- Public comments from families/parents/guardians on how instruction is delivered and the Learning Plan
- Publically announce and review weekly 2-way interaction rates

Reconfirm how instruction (Return to Learn Plan) is going to be delivered during the 20/21 school year including any modifications made to the Extended COVID-19 Learning Plan:

High School (Grades 9 - 12): Learning options include: 1) hybrid learning which includes full face-to-face instruction with clearly defined health and safety protocols M,T,Th,F and virtual learning on Wednesdays; 2) full virtual instruction through a combination of ACEA teacher led or vendor provided courses;

April 2021:

Through April 12, delivery of instruction included both hybrid (in-person) and virtual learning. Due to a recommendation by MDHHS, in-person learning was paused on April 13, and ALL students received instruction remotely. In person learning will resume on April 22, 2021 for hybrid students.
