

ACEA Extended COVID-19 Learning Plan Reconfirmation Meeting December 16, 2020 *Required Monthly After Initial Plan Approval Public Act 149 (August 2020) and Public Act 165 (October 2020) require ACEA to develop and revise as needed an Extended Covid-19 Learning Plan and to convene a monthly reconfirmation meeting for the purpose of:

- Reconfirm how instruction is to be delivered during the 2020-2021 school year
- Public comments from families/parents/guardians on how instruction is delivered and the Learning Plan
- Publically announce and review weekly 2-way interaction rates

Reconfirm how instruction (Return to Learn Plan) is going to be delivered during the 20/21 school year including any modifications made to the Extended COVID-19 Learning Plan:

In person learning was paused due to the November 18 Executive Order, which was extended until December 20; therefore, 100% of students are fully remote. Face to Face students are participating in Synchronous learning during the pause in in-person learning. Beginning December 21, in person learning will resume utilizing the same remote learning schedule currently being used for Monday and Tuesday before Christmas break.
